1. Your personal data is provided on a voluntary basis, yet it is necessary for us to reply to any message sent via the contact form;
2. Your data will be processed pursuant to Article 6(1)(a) of Regulation 2016/679/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, GDPR), specifically on the basis of your express consent;
3. Your data can only be disclosed to duly authorized public authorities and institutions on the basis of the commonly applicable laws;
